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About Cranford Hospice

We provide specialist palliative care in Hawke's Bay - from Mahia in the north, to Takapau in the south. Our goal is to help people who are dying make the most of their time left, to help them live every moment whether they are at home, in an aged care facility or come for a short stay with us in our eight bed inpatient facility.

We offer our services at no cost to the patient regardless of age, ethnicity, means or religion.

We provide the highest possible degree of comfort, peace and dignity.

Our highly-skilled and dedicated team includes doctors, nurses, a pharmacist and family support staff. We are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week to talk through any concerns, offer advice or help manage symptoms. Our Family Support Team offer practical assistance, as well as grief and bereavement support for both the patient and their family/whānau.

We work alongside other health professionals such as GP's and the hospital palliative care team.

Admission to the inpatient unit may be for symptom control, short term respite care, or terminal care when this is no longer possible at home.

Our purpose is to provide care, specialist knowledge and empower others to provide quality palliative care/whakamauru tangata to the people of Hawke's Bay.

Cranford Hospice Palliative Care Services

- Appointments can be held in Wairoa and Central Hawke's Bay, as well as at Cranford Hospice in Hastings or at home.
- Our care encompasses the physical, spiritual, cultural, social and emotional needs of the person and their family/whānau.
- We are partly funded by the Hawke's Bay DHB and partly funded by the community.
- We offer carers/whānau bereavement support services after the death of their loved one.
